



HABITAT FOR HUMANITY CELEBRATES 50TH ANNIVERSARY WITH FAMILY FRIENDLY POP-UP BUILD AT LOWE'S OF WEST DALLAS

*Event Encourages Communities to Meet Neighbors and Celebrate
Habitat's Impact Through Hands-On Volunteerism*

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DALLAS (July 25, 2026) - As affordable homeownership continues to slip out of reach for thousands of North Texas families, Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity and Lowe's are inviting the community to take action during a free, family-friendly Pop-Up Build on Saturday, July 25, celebrating Habitat for Humanity International's 50th anniversary and Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity's 40th anniversary.

Recognizing Habitat's five decades of helping families build strength, stability and self-reliance through affordable homeownership, the event at Lowe's of West Dallas (1710 Chalk Hill Road) is one of 20 celebrations taking place across the country.

"This anniversary celebration is an opportunity to bring our community together while raising awareness of the urgent need for more affordable homes," said Ashley Brundage, President and CEO of Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity. "Homeownership is becoming increasingly out of reach for many hardworking families across North Texas. Partnerships are the key to opening the doors to building strength, stability and self-reliance through affordable homeownership and creating stronger neighborhoods."

The need has never been greater. The average home price in the Dallas-Fort Worth region has climbed to approximately \$405,000, while the area's median household income is \$63,985. A family must earn roughly \$140,000 annually to afford a median-priced home, and Dallas faces a shortage of more than 16,000 attainable homes for families ready to buy.

The celebration will feature interactive building activities that showcase Habitat's mission while bringing neighbors, families and volunteers together. Attendees can participate in family-friendly construction projects, enjoy complimentary birthday cupcakes and food truck offerings, learn about volunteer opportunities, and visit the Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity education booth.

Since 1976, Habitat for Humanity International has partnered with families, volunteers and community organizations to help expand access to safe, decent and affordable housing. Through affordable mortgages, home repairs and neighborhood revitalization efforts, Habitat empowers families to achieve long-term stability while strengthening communities.

As part of the anniversary celebration, Lowe's and Habitat for Humanity have also created a [50th Anniversary Gift Registry](#) featuring tools and supplies that help support Habitat's mission. Community members can donate items online through the registry or drop off tools during the event or at Dallas Area Habitat for Humanity.
